PESO Employment Information System (PEIS)

One of the core services offered by CTU-PESO is the Labor Market Information (LMI). LMI describes the interaction between the labor supply and demand. Furthermore, it presents and interprets how a labor market is functioning, and identifies available labor resources, employment opportunities, and other related information such as wage rates, qualifications, employment conditions, etc.

With the help of PESCO Employment Information System (PEIS), the university is able to have a database of active manpower supply containing the profiles of all persons and employers registered in CTU-PESO which is also needed for submission to DOLE Region VII. The database shows the qualifications and skills of applicants as well as the job vacancies posted by the employers. Also, PEIS gives data on top vacancies for applicants, and top skills for employers in the entire nation.

In 2019, first year of CTU-PESO to use PEIS, the office registered a total of 686 applicants. These applicants were grouped according to gender, age group, civil status, educational attainment, employment status, and work experience.


